Bolbitius reticulatus (Pers.) Ricken

Bolbitius is Greek for cow dung; reticulatus from rete, a net referring to the netted pattern made by wrinkles on the cap

Fruiting Body: cap 2-5 cm; stalk central, 3-6 cm long x 2-6 mm diameter. **Spore Print Color:** rusty brown. **Spores:** basidiospores $8-12 \times 5-6 \mu m$,

elliptical, smooth, pinkish.

Diagnostic macroscopic feature: medium-sized mushroom with violaceous-gray, glutinous cap that has radiating wrinkles, cinnamon gills and white stalk growing on or near decaying wood


