

Cortinarius cinnabarinus Fries

Cortinarius is from cortina, meaning a veil or curtain, in reference to the cobwebby partial veil



Description:

mushroom

Fruiting Body: cap 3-6 cm; stalk central 2-5 cm long x 4-8 mm diameter, equal. **Spore Print Color:** rusty brown. **Spores:** basidiospores 7-9 x 4.5-5.5 μm , elliptical, punctate, brown.

Diagnostic macroscopic feature: the bright cinnamon color of cap, veil, gills and stalk, lack of slime, and early summer fruiting in oak woods helps to distinguish this species

Nutritional Mode: mycorrhizal

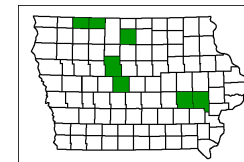
Substrate: on ground
