

Cortinarius flavifolius Peck

Cortinarius is from cortina, meaning a veil or curtain, in reference to the cobwebby partial veil



Description:

mushroom

Fruiting Body: cap 4-15 cm; stalk central 4-12 cm long x 6-18 mm diameter at apex, club-shaped to bulbous at base. **Spore Print Color:** rusty brown.

Spores: basidiospores 6-9 x 5-6 μm , subglobose to oval, rough.

Diagnostic macroscopic feature: the yellow colors of cap and stalk, and large size help distinguish this mushroom

Nutritional Mode: mycorrhizal

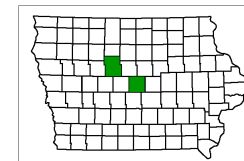
Substrate: on ground
