

## Tricholoma sejunctum (Sowerby) Qué.

Tricholoma from a Greek word for hair or fringe; sejunctum means separated referring to the tendency of the gills to separate from the stalk



### Description:

mushroom

**Fruiting Body:** cap 4-8 cm; stalk central, 5-9 cm long x 1-2 cm diameter. **Spore Print Color:** white.

**Spores:** basidiospores 6-7 x 4-5.5  $\mu\text{m}$ , ellipsoid, smooth, hyaline.

**Diagnostic macroscopic feature:** large yellowish to yellowish green capped mushroom with dark brown to black streaks, growing on ground in late summer or fall in woods

**Nutritional Mode:** mycorrhizal?

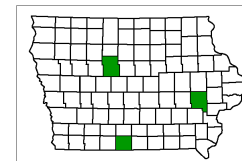
**Substrate:** on ground

**Habitat:** deciduous or coniferous woods

**Fruiting Season:** late summer, fall

**Kingdom:** Fungi

**Phylum:** Basidiomycota
